General Information:

Basic amenities have been provided including clean bedding, fresh towels, bathroom supplies, and more. You also have full access to our washer in the kitchen if you need to do laundry. There is also a Nespresso coffee machine. Please consider that our home is a non-smoking environment. If you need to smoke, we kindly ask you to do so outside and to dispose your cigarettes afterwards.

Washing machine:

You find the detergents below the sink. Use one cap per washing and fill it in the left compartment. The washer is easy to use: just choose "Mix" for a sensor-based washing program. There is an iron in the cupboard next to the fridge and an ironing board behind the curtain in the kitchen as well as a clothes drying rack.

Our home has high-speed Internet access that you may connect to via wireless.

If you have any trouble connecting, try to switch the modem on/off. You find the modem below the kitchen table.



SIGHTS

Explore Innsbruck on foot, rent a bike or use public transportation. Our tip: buy your ticket at the bus station and not in the bus (they are less expensive). Here are the sights you should not miss:

Hafelekar - perfect for walks; easy to reach via the Hungerburg funicular and Nordkettenbahnen (in 20 minutes)

Ambras Castle - don't forget the Chamber of Art and Wonders!

Alpine Zoo - Take the Hungerburg Funicular; perfect for families and kids

360° Tirol Panorama - very impressive museum; audio guides are for free!

Tyrolean Folk Art Museum - right in the center of Innsbruck; combine it with a stroll around the city

Swarovski Crystal World - very famous, go check it out!

Bergisel Ski Jump - use the elevator and have a coffee at the top!



The public transportation is usually punctual and reliable. For the current bus schedule, we recommend the Smartride App of the Tyrolean Lines.

We recommend exploring the city on foot. Everything is close and easy to reach. Another good option: rent a bike

- I mog di..... I really like you
- A Hetz machn..... to have some fun
- Heisl toilet
- Mei schian! Oh my, that's awesome!
- Mogsch di herhockn?.....Wanna sit with us?
